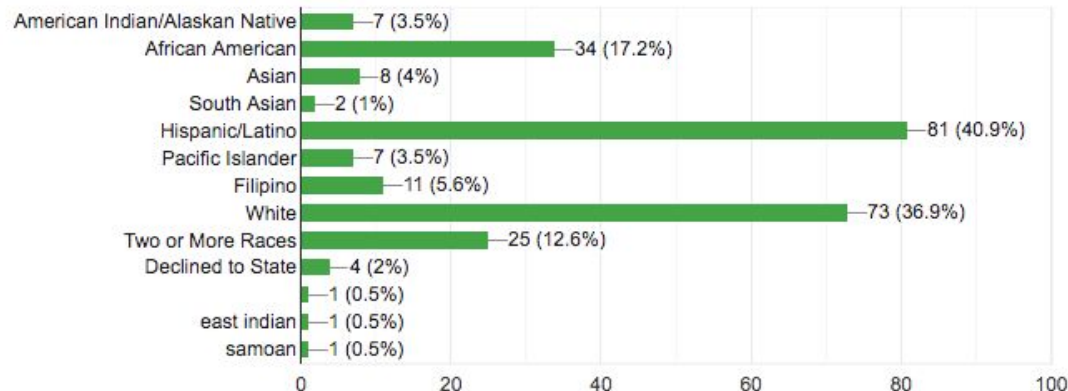

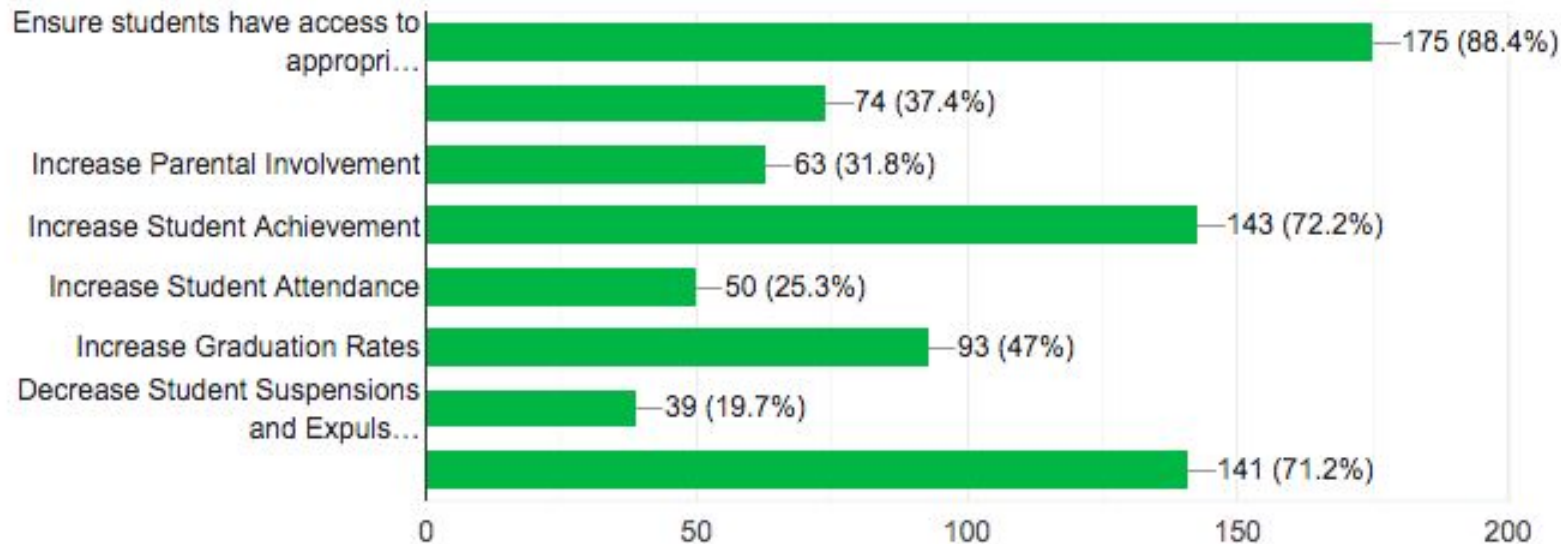

The state outlines eight priorities for the LCAP plan. Which of these priorities are the most important to you? (Check all that apply)



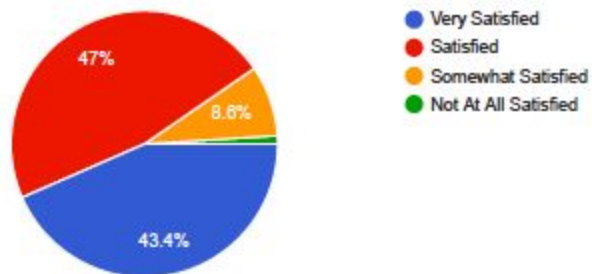

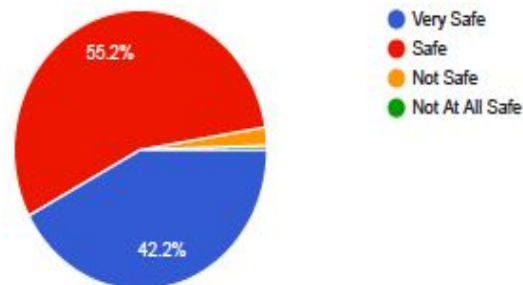
How satisfied are you with the level of instruction your student(s) receive from their teachers?

How would you rate the safety of the overall school campus?

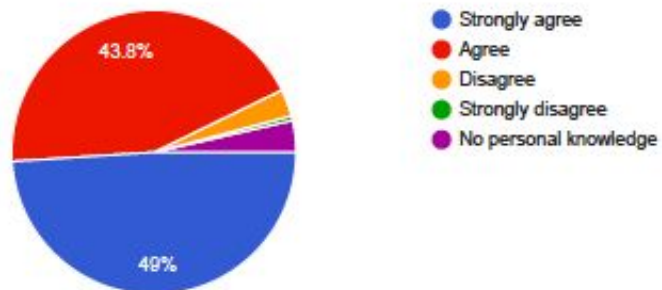

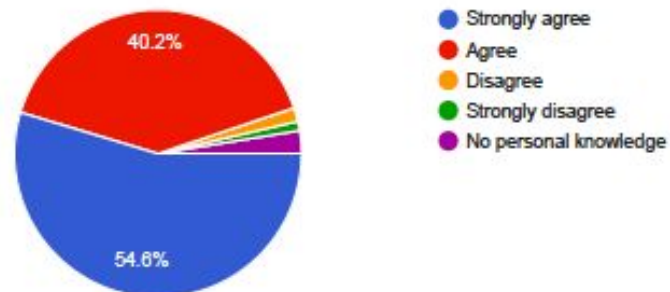

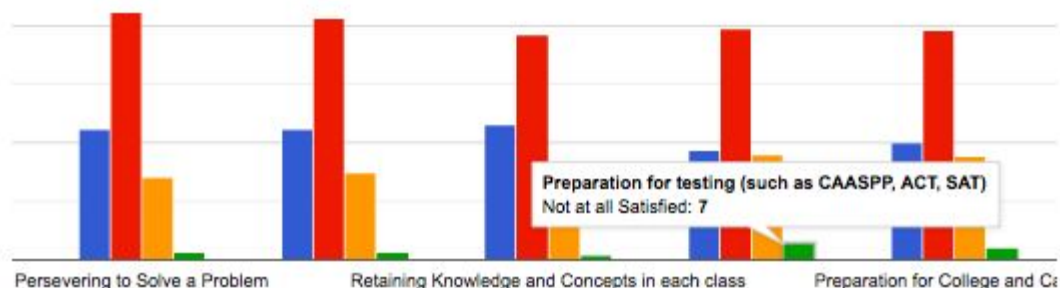

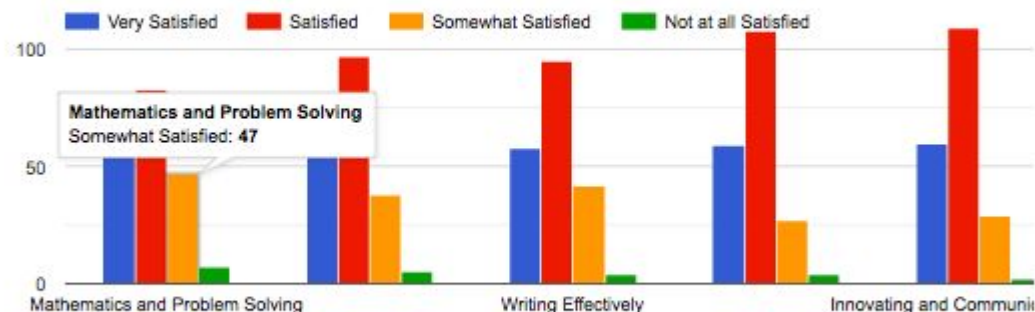


# Things to Improve Parent Perspective

How satisfied are you with the progress your child is making in...:



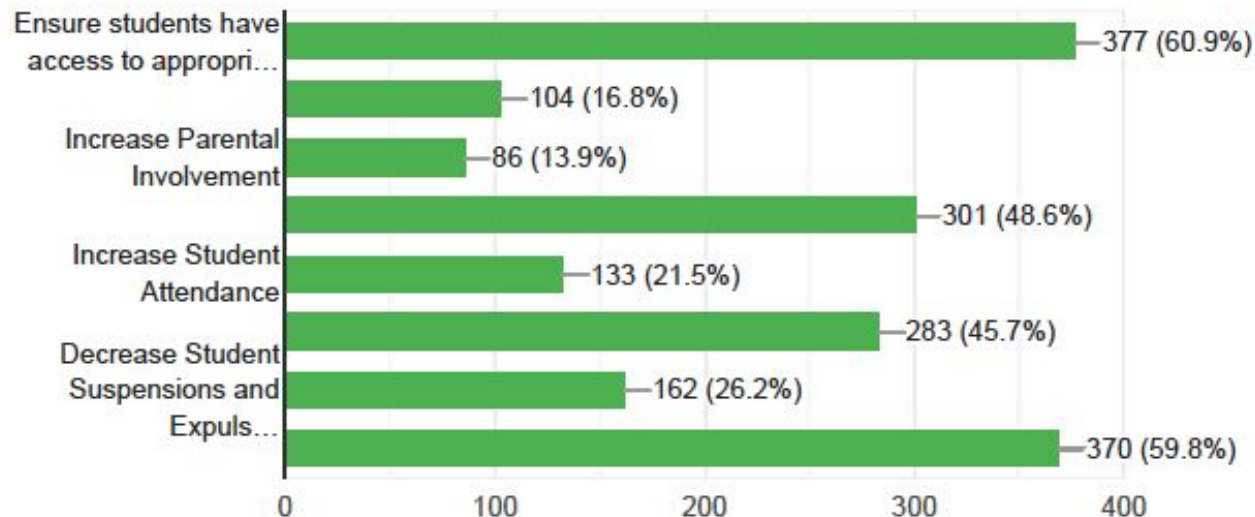
How satisfied are you with the progress your child is making in...:

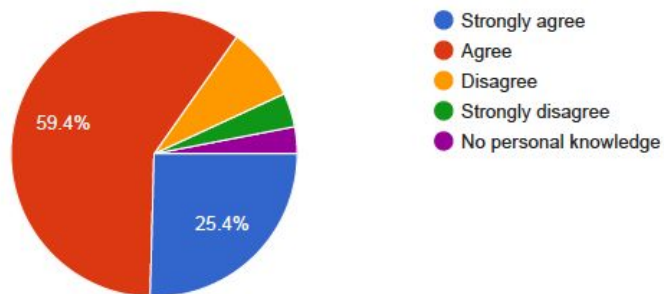

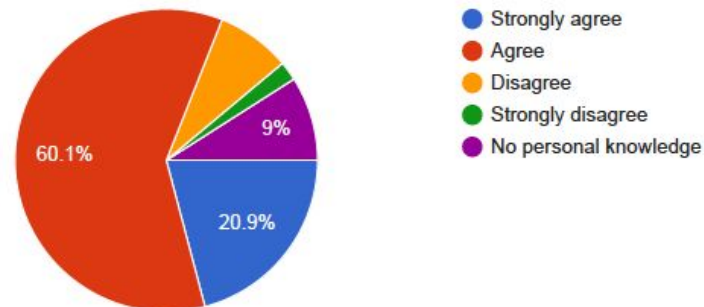

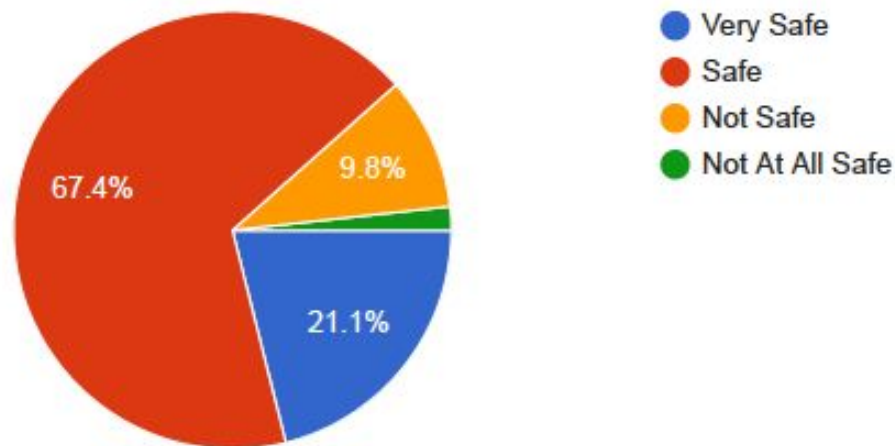

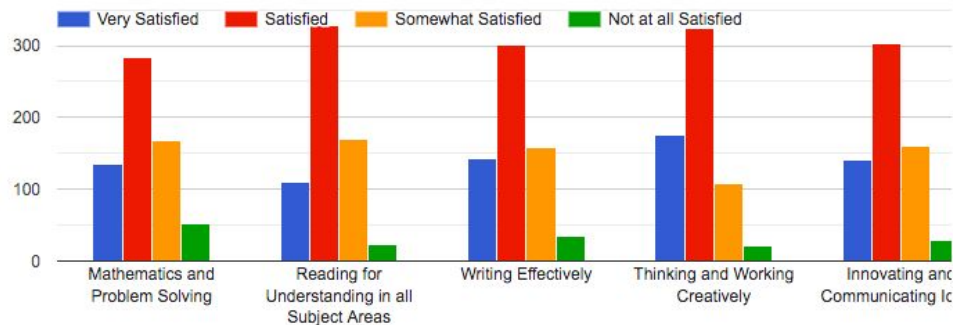
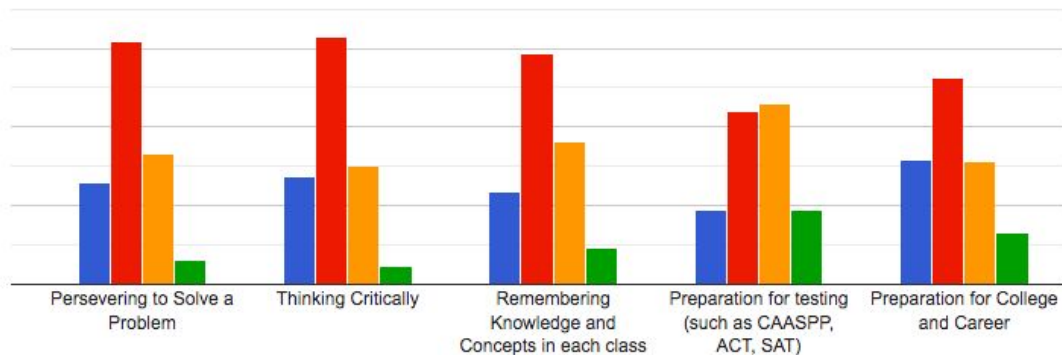
How would you rate the safety of the overall school campus?

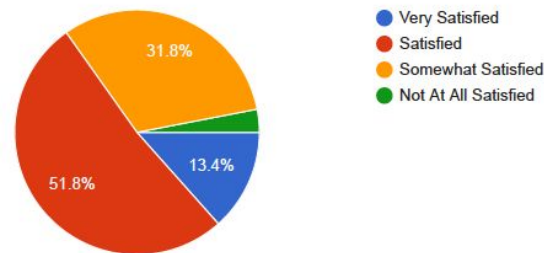
