Leroy Greene Academy (LGA) is a rigorously academic charter school, operated by NUSD to serve students in 6th through 12th grades. We are a public school with the ability to operate differently than a traditional school. We implement challenging academic programs and high-leverage systems that ensure all students are prepared for college. Students complete coursework in two innovative pathways -- Visual Arts & Technology, and Business Entrepreneurship. Our culture of achievement is defined by high expectations for academic performance and citizenship. We value diversity and connectedness, and we believe that the strength of our Lion PRIDE helps to create a rich educational experience focused on ensuring that all Lion students graduate as college ready.

HOW DO I KNOW IF LGA IS RIGHT FOR MY STUDENT?

Leroy Greene Academy, a great fit for any student, offers the opportunity to participate in strong pathways with excellent teacher and community support. Beginning in middle school, students take pathway courses in Visual Arts & Technology and Business Entrepreneurship. In high school, they select one of the two pathways to pursue. Seniors in both pathways join forces in a capstone incubator course, during which they work in teams all year to create, market, and pitch a product or service concept and business plan. Pathway connections with business and community partners provide students with professional and academic skills vital for post-secondary career success. LGA also offers a variety of engaging elective courses, including Spanish, Music and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math) for middle and high school students. Twelve different AP courses are offered, as well as two Pre-AP courses, of English and Visual Arts for 9th Grade students. Students thrive in LGA's unique advisory program, which supports students' academic success and connects them to our Lion PRIDE. Teachers conduct office hours after school to re-teach academic content and to allow students to reassess. Lions participate in a full complement of 6th grade, middle, and high school sports.
