### **A-G Grants**

### **Purpose of the Funds**

The A-G Completion Improvement Grant Program was established to increase the number of California high school students, particularly unduplicated students, who graduate from high school with A-G eligibility and therefore are college ready.



### **A-G Grants**

#### **A-G Access Grants**

Awarded to LEAs that had an A-G completion rate of less than 67%

Must be used towards activities that directly support pupil access to, and successful completion of, the A-G course requirements

### A-G Learning Loss Mitigation Grants

Must be used to allow pupils who received a "D", "F", or "Fail" in an A-G approved course in the 2020–21 school year to retake those A-G courses

If sufficient funds are still available, LEAs may also use grant funds to offer credit recovery opportunities

Allocation: \$75,000

#### **A-G Success Grants**

Awarded to LEAs that had an A-G completion rate of 67% or higher

Recommended that funds be used towards pupils in danger of not receiving a grade of "C" or better in A-G courses

Allocation: \$87,836



#### **A-G Access Grants Mandates**

#### The A-G Access Grants consists of five basic mandates:

- 1. A–G Access Grants shall be used for activities that directly support pupil access to, and successful completion of, the A–G course requirements. Eligible activities may include, but are not limited to, any of the following:
- 2. Providing teachers, administrators, and counselors with professional development opportunities to improve the local educational agency's A–G completion rate.
- 3. Developing comprehensive advising plans and pupil supports, including tutoring programs, to improve the local educational agency's A–G completion rate.
- 4. Expanding access to coursework or other opportunities to satisfy A–G course requirements to all pupils, including, but not necessarily limited to, unduplicated pupils. These opportunities may include, but shall not be limited to, course development, course review, incorporating A–G course requirements into the local educational agency's graduation requirements, and new or expanded partnerships with other secondary or postsecondary educational institutions.
- 5. Advanced Placement fees for unduplicated pupils.



### **Plan Template Recommendations**

### A-G Success Grant activities may include, but shall not be limited to:

- Providing teachers, administrators, and counselors with professional development opportunities
- Developing comprehensive advising plans and pupil supports
- Expanding access to coursework or other opportunities to satisfy A-G course requirements to all pupils, including, but not necessarily limited to, unduplicated pupils.
  - Course development
  - Course review
  - Incorporating A-G course requirements into the LEA's graduation requirements,
- Pay Advanced Placement exam fees for unduplicated pupils
- Direct A-G Success Grant funds towards pupils in danger of not achieving a grade of "C" or better in A-G courses



### **Plan Template Recommendations**

#### **A-G Learning Loss Mitigation Grant:**

- Shall be used to allow students who receive a grde of "D" or "F" or "Fail" in an A-g approved course in the spring semester of 2020 or the 2020-2021 school year to retake those A-G courses.
- The method of offering pupils the opportunity to retake courses shall be determined by the LEA.
- An LEA may use grant funds to officer credit recovery opportunities to all student to ensure students are able to graduate high school on time.

### Multi-Year Plan

#### Possible Planned Actions:

- Extra hours for counselors to support completion of master scheduling based on student needs as well as any support needed during Summer Learning opportunities.
- Credit Recovery Office Hours- Identify students who need to retake courses to be a-g eligible.
- Expand Pre-Ap training to 8th grade students to help students become more successful in college-level courses.
- Professional Development for teachers to continue campus wide alignment of AVID implementation, Pathway Entrepreneurship trainings, and pathway certification development
- Expand Dual Enrollment offerings
- Professional development for AP Teachers
- Offer credit recovery during winter break/spring break
- PSAT 9 since we already do PSAT 10 as a district
- After hours transportation for students



### Monitoring the Plan

### **Additional Reporting Requirements:**

- Report to CDE on or before December 31, 2023 on how we are measuring the impact of the funds received on our A-G completion rate, as identified within our plan, and the outcomes based on those measurements.
- Submit a final report to CDE on or before August 31, 2026, on final outcomes that measure the impact the funds received on our A-G completion rate.



### Monitoring the Plan

### Data Points to be collected and analyzed annually:

- Overall A-G completion rates
- Disaggregated A-G Completion Rates (Student Group & Ethnicity/Race)
- Percent of students taking a course of rigor (AP/DE)
- Disaggregated percent of students taking a course of rigor
- Percent of students who recover failing grades
- Disaggregated percent of students who recover failing grades
